The rules for the use of the roll-off program are the following:

Prohibited Uses:

In order to keep the roll-off program useful and available please do the following:

- dry wrap garbage
- if container is full take waste to other container site or to sanitary landfill
- take large or unusual loads to the sanitary landfill
- condense rubbish, flatten boxes
- use recycling drop-off sites and centers for recyclables (aluminum, plastics, newspaper, glass, etc.)

If any abuse is seen the Health Department should be immediately notified. When containers are full it is requested that Veolia at or 345-7404 be contacted.
